

Gas appliances checklist

The **Gas Appliance (Safety) Regulations 1995** and **General Product Safety Regulations 2005** – states that goods such as second-hand gas fires and cookers must be safe. Get them checked by a qualified competent person. Buyers should be advised to obtain carbon monoxide alarms and have gas appliances professionally installed by Gas Safe registered engineers.

- 1 Has a "GAS SAFE" engineer carried out a gas soundness test? Yes No

- 4 Are the tap handles easy to operate but not liable to be turned on accidentally? Yes No

- 6 If fitted with a fold down lid, does the gas shut off when it is lowered? Yes No
