Main purpose of job

The post holder will directly support the Climate Commissioner in developing and delivering a range of local area energy projects across the city. The post holder will report to the Climate Commissioner and will be responsible for:

- Working closely with the Climate Commissioner and other key stakeholders to develop a pipeline of decarbonisation projects that will include the priority projects identified in the Belfast Local Area Energy Plan and the Queens Island Decarbonisation Plan.
- Coordinating and managing the development and delivery of a portfolio of priority energy projects emerging from the Belfast Local Area Energy Plan and the Queens Island Decarbonisation Plan specifically (but not limited to), a heat network and solar PV projects.
- Developing a portfolio of investable energy projects from the Belfast Local Area Energy Plan and the Queens Island Decarbonisation Plan (including decentralised renewable energy generation and the decarbonisation of heat and transport) and securing funding and finance to support the development, scale up and replication of local energy projects across the city.
- Providing technical expertise to community-based organisations which are developing local energy projects.
- Undertaking effective stakeholder management with public, private and third sector organisations, industry bodies, government and government agencies to build effective relationships and networks to drive growth and capacity in local energy projects.
- Coordinating, tracking and reporting on the delivery of local decarbonisation projects against project milestones, costs and quality requirements and providing regular progress updates to the Resilience and Sustainability Board.
- Providing technical expertise on local area energy systems and decarbonisation investments to the Climate Commission to ensure that its analysis and advice is mainstreamed into existing and emerging plans and projects across the city.
- Being the technical lead on decarbonisation and specific Energy System themes and represent the Council in stakeholder engagements to advance the decarbonisation agenda.

The post holder will deputise for the Climate Commissioner on matters within the post's sphere of responsibility, to support the delivery of the Climate Plan across the city of Belfast.

Summary of responsibilities and personal duties

1. Provide technical oversight and management of planned and existing local decarbonisation projects including the development of the city centre heat network and the Net Zero Belfast project. Identify and set appropriate project controls and drive project tasks to completion in accordance with the agreed schedule.
2. Develop a pipeline of investable local decarbonisation projects arising from the Local Area Energy Plan and the Queens Island Decarbonisation Plan, undertaking technical activities and engaging with potential project leads/ proposers and/or decision takers to scope, benchmark, aggregate and/or upscale feasible local decarbonisation projects as part of a project pipeline across the city.
3. Coordinate the city-wide Local Area Energy Plan delivery group to enable and facilitate partnership working to accelerate delivery of the LAEP.
4. Undertake and, or support others to undertake all stages of the project development process, including concept development, feasibility studies and business cases that enable investment decisions to be made to achieve delivery.
5. Work collaboratively with project leads/ proposers and/or decision-takers to develop full business cases and help to secure funding for projects to enable investment decisions to be reached.
6. Ensure new decarbonisation projects are fully compliant with all current and future energy and carbon regulatory obligations and aligned with international best practice.
7. Support the establishment and management of appropriate governance and delivery structures for projects as they emerge including all technical standards, systems and processes are adhered to.
8. Develop, manage, and implement appropriate project performance management frameworks and risk registers, allowing key stakeholders to be kept informed of progress against targets, working closely with the MLR Officer to develop and ensure key performance metrics are achieved.
9. Monitor and report against project milestones and provide assurance on delivery to senior management, elected members and/or other stakeholders as may be appropriate.
10. Review and quality assure project risk management arrangements, monitoring and reporting on risks and issues, developing mitigating actions and escalating as appropriate.
11. Ensure that delivery requirements are met consistently and effectively throughout the programme and project lifecycles and that all financial, legal, procurement, design and other technical inputs for each programme are fit for purpose and in line with appropriate regulations, council policies and agreed standards.
12. Assist in the production of timely committee, briefings, performance management and financial reports and to attend appropriate committees, corporate management teams, programme boards as and when required.

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13. Identify and respond to emerging funding opportunities, developing, managing and tracking bids. Engage with businesses, researchers and communities to identify opportunities for collaborative working and business case development working closely with the Climate Commissioner and other members of the Climate Team.
 14. Provide energy sector expertise to community-based organisations which are developing local energy and decarbonisation projects.
 15. Identify, articulate and seek common solutions to barriers that are preventing the delivery of local energy and decarbonisation projects.
 16. Be knowledgeable of policy and able to utilise the relevant national, regional and local strategies and plans in support of delivering Net Zero at the local level.
 17. Liaise with and raise the awareness of relevant stakeholders to secure the highest levels of buy in and collaboration to facilitate project delivery.
 18. Support the ongoing management and mobilisation of decarbonisation projects to ensure returns on investment and the delivery of savings.
 19. Support, and lead as appropriate, the Council's role in developing and implementing new projects, tools and approaches to deliver Net Zero.
 20. Build relationships with key stakeholders to support the delivery of the City's Net Zero ambitions working closely with the Climate Commissioner and other members of the Climate Team.
 21. Have a broad understanding and up to date knowledge of district heat networks and local energy systems approaches and how to develop and deliver decarbonisation projects.
 22. Proactively contribute to the sharing of experience and expertise across the Community Planning Partnership and with all relevant council departments.
 23. Support the Climate Commission in delivering independent, authoritative reports and advice related to local energy systems.
 24. Ensure international best practice and innovative technologies and approaches are integrated into new and existing decarbonisation projects, making appropriate recommendations for change and sharing knowledge where possible.
 25. Be an effective ambassador for an inclusive, resilient, Net Zero Belfast, representing the council at international, national, regional, local forums and partnerships, in order to build and maintain excellent working relationships to the benefit of the Council and the strategic partnerships, in its Climate Plan objectives.
 26. Coordinate the analysis of information gathered at visits, seminars and conferences, preparing appropriate briefing papers, reports and analysis on this work for wider circulation.
 27. Manage all budgetary and other resources assigned to support the delivery of decarbonisation projects, including the preparation of an annual estimate, section business plan and the management of approved budgets in line with corporate and departmental policies and procedures.

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28. Account for the successful delivery, implementation and administration of funding, in accordance with the principles of performance management and the council's policies as required by the Climate Commissioner.
 29. Assist with the preparation and validation of any tendering process including advising on and assisting in the negotiation and appointment of bidders and bid evaluations to ensure that the council achieves optimal value for money.
 30. Maintain a flexible approach and the efficient allocation of resources to enable agile working in a complex, fast-moving environment.
 31. Lead, motivate and manage all allocated staff that may be assigned to ensure effective service delivery and to be responsible for reviewing and implementing a proper staff training and development programme.
 32. Participate in all induction and in-service training provided by Belfast City Council and in the induction and support of all newly appointed staff and other human resource management policies and procedures, as appropriate, including, absence management, disciplinary and grievance procedure.
 33. Ensure all policy development, consultations and frameworks comply with the council's statutory duties under Section 75 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998 and other applicable legislation and the council's Equality Scheme.
 34. Participate, as directed, in the council's recruitment and selection procedures.
 35. Act in accordance with the council and departmental policies and procedures including customer care, equal opportunities, health and safety, safeguarding and any pertinent legislation.
 36. Undertake the duties in such a way as to enhance and protect the reputation and public profile of the council.
 37. Undertake such other relevant duties as may, from time to time be required.

This job description has been written at a time of significant organisational and structural change and it will be subject to review and amendment as the demands of the role and the organisation evolve. Therefore, the post-holder will be required to be flexible, adaptable and aware that they may be asked to perform tasks, duties and responsibilities which are not specifically detailed in the job description, but which are commensurate with the role.

Essential criteria

Qualification and experience

Applicants **must**, as at the closing date for receipt of application forms, have a third level qualification in engineering, or equivalent qualification **and** be able to demonstrate on the application form, by providing personal and specific examples on the application form, at least two years' relevant experience in each of the following three areas:

- a) bringing complex, collaborative, multidisciplinary decarbonisation projects to market with experience of heat networks and, or on-site generation;
- b) designing and undertaking feasibility studies, developing business cases and funding applications for decarbonisation projects; and
- c) building and maintaining effective collaborative relationships with a range of internal and external stakeholders, analysing and resolving complex issues affecting project delivery while displaying effective judgment.

Special skills and attributes

Applicants must be able to demonstrate evidence of the following skills and attributes which will be tested at interview:

Team working and leadership skills: the ability to lead and foster a motivating, engaging and supportive environment to maximise both contribution and potential of their team members to achieve objectives.

Communication and influencing skills: the ability to display effective written and oral communications skills in both formal and informal settings with the ability to influence and persuade others on complex issues using plain, concise language. The ability to build rapport and maintain the engagement and commitment of others to secure their support in the delivery of projects.

Project management and work planning skills: the ability to determine organisational priorities and resource requirements for complex programmes and projects and manage allocated workload on the basis of available resources and to work to tight deadlines to ensure effective delivery.

Business case development skills: the ability to develop successful business cases and manage complex tenders, as both a Bid Manager and Bid writer compiling professional responses working to strict deadlines.

Technical, analytical and decision making skills: the ability to understand legislative and regulatory requirements, interpret energy assessments, scope feasibility studies and other project development studies, finance incentives etc and to present the benefits to stakeholders, exercise critical judgement in arriving at practical solutions and communicate findings clearly.

Budget management, financial and commercial awareness skills: the ability to manage and monitor project budgets, with awareness of financial administration and probity requirements.

Partnership working skills: the ability to form, maintain and enhance partnership working with internal and external stakeholders, networks and communities to build consensus around key projects.

Performance management skills: the ability to performance manage projects including the setting of objectives and targets, monitoring criteria and evaluation performance measures.

Political sensitivity skills: the ability to show awareness and sensitivity in managing successfully within a political environment including working effectively with elected members, partner organisations and other agencies.

Short-listing criterion

In addition to the above qualification and experience, Belfast City Council reserves the right to short-list only those applicants who, as at the closing date for receipt of application forms, can demonstrate relevant experience of (d) developing and delivering district heat networks using low carbon technologies.

Job applicant privacy notice

Belfast City Council is the Data Controller under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR) for the personal data it processes relating to job applicants. Processing data from job applicants allows the council to manage the recruitment process, assess and confirm an applicant's suitability for employment and decide to whom to offer a job. It may also need to process data from job applicants to respond to and defend against legal claims.

If you apply for this job, you will be consensually providing your personal data to the council whose lawful basis for processing it is for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority.

The council will collect a range of information about you, including:

- your name, address and contact details, including email address and telephone number;

Appointment

The appointment will be made by the selection panel, but will be subject to ratification by the director of the relevant department.

There may be a reserve list of applicants drawn up for this post which would last for a maximum of 12 months. Should a similar post become vacant within this time, it may be offered to those on the reserve list, in order of merit, without further interview. For generic-type posts, this may include posts in another department. **These posts may be either full-time, part-time or job share on a temporary or fixed term basis.**

If you are offered and you accept a temporary position e.g. a temporary part-time position for 3 months, and another temporary part-time position arises from the same recruitment campaign e.g. for 1 year, regardless of whether or not you are still working in your temporary part-time position, you will not be offered any further temporary part-time position.

However, in certain circumstances, when all relevant applicants on the reserve list for temporary vacancies, full-time or part-time, have been offered opportunities for which they expressed a preference on their application form, and if the timing of the reserve list is still valid and there are still temporary vacancies to fill before the reserve list expires, the council reserves the right to 'revisit' the reserve list in strict order of merit. This is the only time when an individual who has been appointed to a temporary position e.g. a temporary part-time position can be offered another temporary part-time position.

If candidates do not respond within the above time frames, the post will be offered, in order of merit, to the next person on the reserve list. The names of those candidates who have not responded within the above timeframes will be retained on the reserve list, in order of merit, to be considered for future vacant posts.

This is a fixed term contract post for two years with the possibility of extension, subject to funding. An existing permanent employee of Belfast City Council will, if successful, retain the right to return to their substantive post at the conclusion of the fixed term contract. An existing temporary or fixed term contract employee will, if successful, be appointed on the basis of a further temporary or fixed term contract with no automatic right to revert back to their temporary or fixed term contract post. Similarly, an existing agency assignee will, if successful, be appointed on the basis of a fixed term contract but with no automatic right to revert back to their original agency assignment. Temporary and fixed term contract employees and agency assignees should give consideration to this prior to applying or accepting this post.

Remuneration

The salary will be determined by the council in line with that determined by the National Joint Council for Local Government Services, currently Grade 11, SCP 45 to 48, £53,630 - £56,918 per annum (in normal circumstances, the starting salary is the minimum point), paid monthly by direct payment by the Bankers Automated Clearing System (BACS) to a bank or building society account of your choice.

Location

The person appointed will be based initially in the City Hall, Donegall Square, Belfast but will be required to work in and/or visit other locations.

Pre-employment checks

Prior to taking up duty the person recommended for appointment must:

- (a) Enter into an agreement which sets out the main terms and conditions of employment.
- (b) Provide evidence of the right to work and reside in the UK via either:
 - a digital identity check via the council's Identity Service Provider (IDSP). To use this method, you will need to hold a current UK or Irish biometric passport or passport card.

- (e) Provide two satisfactory work references. If suitably satisfactory references are not received, they will not be offered the appointment.
- (f) Pass satisfactorily a medical assessment by the council's Occupational Health Service provider.

- (h) Complete a disclosure of criminal convictions form, under the Rehabilitation of Offenders (NI) Order 1978. All applicants who are recommended for appointment to a post within Belfast City Council must provide details in respect of any criminal convictions which are not regarded as 'spent' convictions. conviction is considered relevant to the post and will be seen in the context of the job, the nature of the offence and the responsibility for the care of existing client/customer and employees.

If the person appointed acquires a conviction throughout the course of their employment with Belfast City Council, they must bring this to the attention of their line manager/departmental HR representative. Failure to comply with this request can result in a breach of the terms and conditions of employment and may result in sanction or dismissal. Any information will be dealt with confidentially and help is available.

Council policies

The person appointed will be required to comply with all current and future council policies, procedures, guidelines, agreed working practices and any relevant collective agreements incorporated into the contract of employment.

Conditions

The general conditions of service as prescribed from time to time by the National Joint Council for Local Government Services and by the council for its officers shall apply to the appointment and the Single Status Implementation Agreement dated 2007 as renegotiated from time to time is hereby incorporated into the contract of employment

A copy of the council's Disciplinary Procedure and Grievance Procedure will be issued to all new employees at the council's Induction Course.

Please note if you are an applicant with previous local authority service in England, Scotland, Wales etc., you are advised to clarify your particular situation with regard to the continuity of this service, prior to accepting an offer of appointment from Belfast City Council.

Service and hours of duty

The hours of duty are 37 per week, working five days per week, Monday to Friday. Flexible working hours are in operation between 7.30am and 6.30pm, with set core times that the person appointed must be in work. However, the person appointed will be required to start and finish work at specific times that suit the operational needs of the service and they will, when advised, be required to work outside of these hours for operational reasons including on extra statutory, bank and/or public holidays.

In accordance with the National Joint Council for Local Government Services National Agreement on Pay and Conditions of Service variations to the established working week or patterns of work will be reasonable and subject to adequate notice.

Annual leave

Annual leave and extra statutory, bank or public holiday entitlement is calculated in hours/minutes.

A person appointed on the standard full time hours of 37 per week will be entitled to 177.6 hours (24 days) annual leave, plus 88.8 hours (12 days) bank or other holidays.

Annual leave entitlement will be increased by 37 hours (5 days) in the case of officers who have not less than 5 years' continuous service and by a further 22.2 hours (3 days) in the case of officers who have not less than 10 years' continuous service.

Figures in brackets represent the number of days based upon a standard day of 7.4 hrs.

For individuals who do not work the standard full-time hours, annual leave and extra statutory, bank or public holiday entitlement will be calculated on pro-rata basis to their contracted hours, based on the standard full time hours of 37 per week and a standard day of 7.4 hours (i.e. 7 hrs 24 minutes).

Employees are entitled to a holiday with a normal day's pay for each of the statutory, general and public holidays as they occur. Where the balance of the employee's public / bank and statutory holiday entitlement has been exhausted, additional leave taken for public / bank and statutory holidays will be deducted from the employee's annual leave entitlement.

All employees required to work on extra statutory, bank or public holidays will be remunerated in accordance with Part 3, paragraph 2 of the National Joint Council for Local Government Services National Agreement on Pay and Conditions of Service.

The leave year commences on 1 April. If an employee starts part way through the annual leave year, the employee will receive annual leave entitlement on a pro rata basis, calculated on the number of days remaining in the current leave year from the first day of employment.

Sick leave

This scheme is intended to supplement Statutory Sick Pay and Incapacity Benefit so as to maintain normal pay during defined periods of absence on account of sickness, disease, accident or assault. Absence in respect of normal sickness is entirely separate from absence through industrial disease, accident or assault arising out of or in the course of employment with a local authority. Periods of absence in respect of one shall not be set off against the other for the purpose of calculating entitlements under the scheme. Employees are entitled to receive sick pay for the following periods:

During first year of service	one month's full pay and (after completing four months service) two months half pay
During second year of service	two months' full pay, and two months' half pay
During third year of service	four months' full pay, and four months' half pay
During fourth and fifth years of service	five months' full pay, and five months' half pay
After five years' service	six months' full pay, and six months' half pay

Superannuation

The person appointed will automatically become a member of the Local Government Pension Scheme (Northern Ireland) LGPS (NI) in line with scheme regulations. They may opt out of the scheme. However, the council is required to comply with automatic enrolment provisions and will automatically enroll the person appointed at certain times. Appointees (including for casual posts), who do not meet the criteria for immediate automatic enrolment, can opt to join the scheme by contacting Payroll in writing (email payroll@belfastcity.gov.uk). The LGPS (NI) is administered by Northern Ireland Local Government Officers' Superannuation Committee (NILGOSC) (www.nilgosc.org.uk).

Canvassing

Canvassing in any form, oral or written, direct or indirect, will disqualify an applicant for appointment. Candidates can, however, contact the relevant department for further information about the post. The person from the relevant department who provides further information should not be a member of the selection panel.

Notice

The minimum period of notice to be given by an employee shall normally be the ordinary period from one payment of salary or wages to the next.

Belfast City Council may terminate an employee's employment with the council by giving the following period of notice:

Probationary period

The person appointed may be required to complete a six month probationary period, if this is a requirement of the relevant department, and during this time one week's notice will be given by the council to terminate employment.

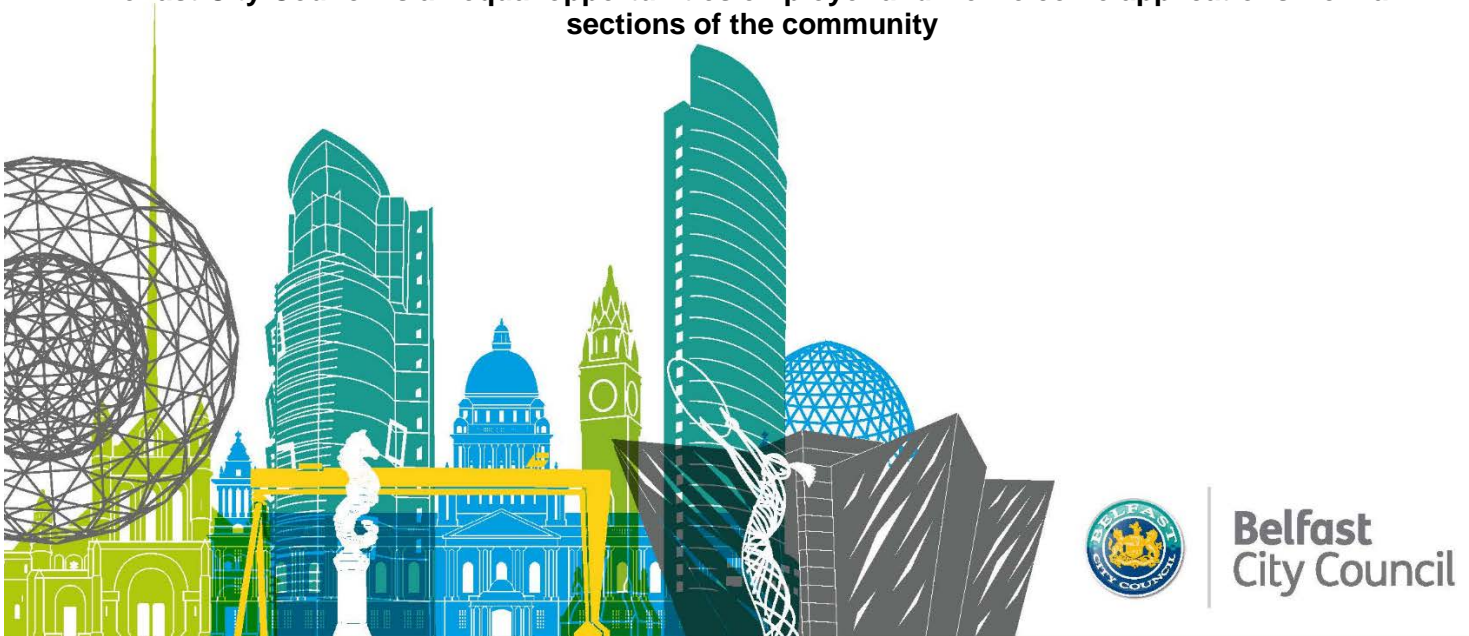
